Welcome to English's great new 2010 wine list, featuring a number of new wines whilst retaining many of your old favourites. I'm pleased to report that, as usual, we have tasted an enormous quantity of wine on your behalf(!) and listened to much good advice. The new list features over eighty individual wines with thirty seven whites, four rosés, and fourteen reds. As well as sixteen Champagnes and sparkling wines there are dessert wines and a half bottle selection.

Our wines by the glass section has gone from strength to strength since it was introduced a couple of years ago and there are some exciting new wines to try this time and if you wish they are all available by the bottle as well!

I'm pleased to report that very few prices have increased this year and most importantly we have managed to obtain some extremely good deals on a few wines year and have passed these on to you by way of lower prices. Alas these offers are time limited until around September 2010 and we will have to revise some prices sometime after then. I would point out that the St Clair Sauvignon Blanc and represent exceptional value with the saving on the former over £5.00 per bottle.

We take a considerable amount of care choosing our wines list and have not only met many of the producers personally but have visited many of them as well and seen their wines being made. Quite a few have dined at English's as well.

<i>At 1700 metres, Michel Torino's vineyards are amongst the highest in the world, getting 350 days of sunshine per year with a consistent breeze cooling things down. His Torrontes reserve is simply superb being fresh and appealing and a great partner for our seafood.</i>	
Sauvignon 2009, Cantina Cortaccia, Alton Adige, Italy	£24.95
<i>The constant breeze over the nearby Adige River exerts a climate-regulating influence on this expression of Sauvignon Blanc. The deep soils produce a filigree sort of Sauvignon that has a balanced, juicy effect upon the palate. Lively acidity gives the body a sharp contour, and flavours are classic gooseberry, asparagus and freshly-cut grass.</i>	
Frascati Superiore DOC 2008/9, Poggio le Volpi, Lazio, Italy	£24.95

<i>A really delicious Sauvignon Blanc from the village of St Bris de Vineaux, to the West of Chablis. Fresh Sauvignon bouquet, showing elegance on the palate with crisp acidity to maintain the perfect balance.</i>

<i>Made by a co-operative up in the hills of Campania, this dry white, is made from the native Falanghina grape and offers an intense yellow colour and touches of ripe pineapple and pear. Soft and balanced in the mouth with a long aromatic finish.</i>	
Gavi 2008 DOCG La Raia, Piemonte, Italy	£26.95
<i>Made by Sussex-born winemaker Tom Dean now living in Northern Italy, this organic Gavi from La Raia offers a full, soft feel on the mouth with white flower, citrus and toffee aromas.</i>	
Riesling 2008/9, Dopff au Moulin, Alsace, France	£27.95
<i>Established in Riquewihr in 1574 the 13th generation of the Dopff family are now producing some of the best Alsace wines available all from their 70 hectare estate. This is excellent Riesling country. Discreetly fruity nose with a touch of minerals Crisp, bone dry, lively on the palate and so refreshing!</i>	
Grüner Veltliner "Spiegel" 2008/9, Weingut Rabl, Kamptal, Austria ##	£27.95
<i>A fine fresh bouquet, with lemon, citrus and mineral tones on the palate, through to a balanced and elegant finish. Rabl winery is located in the prestigious Kamptel-Donau (Danube) wine region and enjoys a wine making tradition stretching back to 1828.</i>	
Pioneer Block 3, Sauvignon Blanc, 2008/9, St Clair, Marlborough, New Zealand ##	£27.95
<i>We don't offer any excuses for listing another of St Clair's Sauvignon Blancs. This wine is made from small parcels of outstanding fruit where the terroir set these wines apart. Intensely pungent aromas of passion fruit and gooseberry with underlying herbaceous notes. This Sauvignon Blanc is distinctively Marlborough and has a vibrant palate of passion fruit, gooseberry and aromatic fresh herbs.</i>	
Saint Veran 2007/08, Domaine Botti, Burgundy, France ##	£29.95
<i>Traditionally made, blended from a single Domaine and several South facing vineyard plots with a mixture of 20 year and 50 year old vines. This wine combines the mineral notes combined with creamy, ripe fruit through to a crisp and clean finish. As the wine matures, it acquires an aroma of roasted almonds and honey.</i>	
Albarino 2008, Serra da Estrela, Rias Baixos, Spain	£31.95
<i>The small DO of Rias Baixos situated in Galicia in the north-west of Spain is home to the variety of Albarino, one of the most sought after white varieties in Spain. This wine has a rounded, mineral flavour with melon and citrus tones and fresh, balanced acidity. Albarino is the perfect accompaniment to fish and seafood.</i>	
Chardonnay 2008, Penny's Hill, McLaren Vale, Australia	£31.95
<i>A partially wooded Chardonnay showing gentle flavours of tropical fruits and ripe peaches, carefully underlain with toasty oak. A well-balanced wine with a fine, juicy middle palate and a long and lean finish.</i>	
Mâcon Péronne Réserve Blanc 2007, Domaine de la Condemine, Burgundy, France ##	£32.95
<i>Domaine de la Condemine is situated in the heart of the Maconnais. More than half the vines are 100 years old. Made from 100% Chardonnay this wine has a hint of sweetness from hand harvested ripe fruit. It has a rich nutty style, good mineral expression and good long finish.</i>

Gewürztraminer 2008/9, Cantina Tramin, Alto Adige, Italy	£33.95
<i>Tramin is thought to be the birth place of the Traminer white grape (Gewürztraminer). Founded in 1898, Cantina Tramin has 280 wine growing members who follow it's strict directives on the cultivation of the vines. Tramin's winemaker, Willi Sturz, was "Italian winemaker of the year 2004" Good spice and minerals with tropical fruit and lycees. Well structured, with good balancing acidity and a long finish</i>	
Riesling QBA Yellow Seal 2008/9, Schloss Johannisberg, Rheingau, Germany	£36.95
<i>Steeped in history the vineyards in the legendary Schloss Johannisberg were planted on the orders of the Roman Emperor Charlemagne. Since 1720 the vineyards have been planted solely with Riesling. The wine is full and fragrant with a slightly fruity nose with hints of peach and lemon.</i>

Montagny Premiere Cru "Les Platières" 2007, Domaine Berthenet, Burgundy, France	£37.95
<i>This family owned 4th generation Domaine owns some of the best hill-side sites in Montagny. The wine is a pale yellow colour with green tints. Round and smooth with discreet oak, well balanced between freshness and softness with good length and sustained mineral flavours.</i>	
Sancerre 2008/9, Domaine Gérard Millet, Loire Valley, France # #	75 cl Bottle: £37.95 37.5 cl Half bottle: £20.95
<i>The Millet family have been making wines for five generations and have 20 hectares of vines around the various villages of the Sancerre region. This vibrant Sauvignon notes of grapefruit and lemon with good weight and a clean crisp finish.</i>	
Enosi 2006, Baron di Pauli, Caldaro, Alto Adige, Italy	£39.95
<i>di Pauli is one of the "stand-out" producers in a region of Italy with arguably the highest quality winemaking in the country. Enosi is blended from 50% Riesling, 35% Sauvignon and 15% Gewürztraminer. It has great balance, offers a lively exotic nose of peach, elderberry and citrus.</i>	
Chardonnay 2008/9, Hamilton Russell Vineyards, Hemel-en-Aarde Valley, Hermanus, South Africa	£39.95
<i>A tight, mineral style of Chardonnay with classic Hamilton Russell vineyards length and complexity. The wine has bright, natural acidity and depth indicative of the extremely low yields used to produce this elegant wine.</i>	
Chablis Premier Cru Vaucopins 2008/9, Patrick Piuze, Burgundy, France # #	£44.95
<i>Certainly a winemaker to be watched, Patrick Piuze arrived in Burgundy from Quebec a dozen or so years ago and set up his own business only in 2008! All his wines come from old vines with an age between 38-80 years old. His wines have long fermentation, use indigenous yeasts and have a minimum of intervention. The Vaucopins has enormous strength and viscosity. Excellent!</i>	
Pouilly Fuisse Prestige 2007, Domaine Ferrand, Burgundy, France	£44.95
<i>Producing wine over three generations this Domaine is now run by Nadine Ferrand and comprises of six hectares in the heart of the Pouilly Fuisse appellation. Ripe fruit blended with oak, a round and creamy flavour with a nutty, toffee finish. 30% new oak is used together with traditional vinification to obtain richness and complexity.</i>	
St Joseph Blanc 2008/9, Domaine Courbis, Rhone Valley, France # #	£44.95
<i>A blend of mostly the Marsanne and Rousanne grape varieties this St Joseph Blanc is fermented at low temperatures and is kept on its fine lees until the spring to develop additional complexity.</i>	
Pouilly Fume 2006/7, Chateau de Tracy, Loire Valley, France # #	£45.95
<i>With a history extending back to at least 1396, Chateau Tracy is still family owned and this famous estate produces a beautifully balanced, classic, fragrant Sauvignon Blanc with a lovely, fresh minerality, classically styled and elegant.</i>	
St Aubin Premiere Cru "Charmois" 2006/7, Domaine Marc Morey, Burgundy, France	£49.95
<i>Traditionally made with ageing in 25% new oak barriques Domaine Marc Morey have an enviable reputation with wine-maker Bernard Mollard having achieved world renown since the 1990s. Expressive and elegant with balanced oak and a lovely layered rich flavour with complementing minerality.</i>	
Meursault "Le Limozin" 2007/8 Domaine René Monnier, Burgundy, France # #	£49.95
<i>Founded in 1723, the Monnier family have built up one of the biggest private Domaines in the Côte de Beaune. Their Meursault "Le Limozin" is from a single vineyard site and shows great finesse and weight with well integrated oak and lovely length.</i>	
Chassagne Montrachet 1er Cru 'Les Chaumées' 1993/7, #	£79.95
Remoissenet Père et Fils, Burgundy, France	
<i>The famous house of Remoissenet has the largest cellars of aged Burgundy in the world. Very rich and elegant style with lovely weight and great length. Mature white Burgundy at its peak.</i>	

Rose Wines

- Pinot Grigio Blush Venezie Giulia IGT 2009, Paolo Sacchetto, Veneto, Italy ## £18.95
A fine and fresh pinot grigio rose made by Paolo Sachetto's excellent winery in Trebaseleghe. An ideal accompaniment for our seafood.
- Gris de Gris 2007/08, Chateau Ksara, Bekka Valley, Lebanon ## £22.95
Château Ksara is Lebanon's oldest winery and its roots can be traced back to 1857. This lovely rose is made from Carignan and Grenache grapes. It's salmon pink colour is the result of a short period of maceration on the skins. Very fresh and clean with a dry finish.
- "Cuvée Marie Christine" 2008/9 Château l'Aumérade ## £23.95
 Cru Classé AC Côtes de Provence, Provence, France
Made from a blend of Syrah, Grenache and Cinsault, this coral coloured Rosé is presented in the special patented Marie Christine bottle designed in the 1950's. It is spicy and delicate with fine, fruity flavours making it very drinkable in style.
- Albarosa Rosato Aglianico del Taburno 2008, Cantine del Taburno, Campania, Italy £24.95
Made with the Aglianico grape, usually noted for the serious reds it produces, Taburno is situated in the Province of Benevento in the Campania region of Italy. The grapes are harvested by hand from the best areas of the vineyard and then undergo strict selection to ensure they reach complete maturity. 2008 was a good vintage and offers a refreshing balance of crisp minerality and layer upon layer of red fruit and berries. It is characterised by good fruit and structure.

Red Wines

- Beaujolais Villages 2008/9, Chateau de Souzy, 75 cl Bottle: £22.95
 Signé Vigneron, Beaujolais, France 37.5 cl Half bottle: £12.45
An inviting aroma of red berries typical of Gamay through to a palate which is medium bodied with crisp acidity and an abundance of blackcurrant and raspberry on the palate. Soft and rounded on the finish.
- Cuma Cabernet Sauvignon 2008/9 (Organic) Michel Torino, Cafayate, Argentina £18.95
Lots of cassis flavours with a hint of leather through to a meaty palate with notes of olives and black pepper! Michel Torino's vineyards are amongst the highest in the world and get 350 days of sunshine a year! Their vineyards have been certified as 100% organic since 2006.
- Merlot Reserva 2008/9, Viña Carmen, Colchagua, Chile ## £20.95
A pioneering and energetic producer, Carmen have been producing wines since 1850. Winemaker Stefano Gandolini has made a stylish and elegant wine which is outstanding value.
- Rioja Crianza 2006/7, Bodegas Ondarre, Rioja, Spain ## £21.45
Powerful fruit aromas well combined with hints of oak ageing. On the palate, it reveals concentrated, ripe fruit flavours and good structure.
- Rosso di Savignola IGT 2005, Savignola Paolina, Greve in Chianti, Tuscany, Italy £21.95
This is Sangiovese in a sunny mood! Medium in body but with enough gusto to hold its own against most dishes. Attractive autumn berry flavours and a little smoke. The Fabbri family purchased in the estate in 1780 and wine production started in the 1800s.. Savignola has a strong history of female winemakers with Paolina taking over from her grand mother between the wars and Paolina's great grand daughter Ludivca and her husband now in charge.
- Barbaresco 2006/7 DOCG "Magno", San Silvestro, Piemonte, Italy ## £31.95
The Sartirano family have been producing wines here since 1871. The firm has only been bottling their wines since the 1970's. Prior to that their wines were sold in 54 Litre barrels! Complex bouquet with hints of violets, dark chocolate, coffee, almonds and pepper in the background. A dry, full bodied red with balanced oak and firm tannins.
- Nipozzano Chinati Rufina Riserva 2006 DOCG, Marchesi de' Frescobaldi # £33.95
 Chianti Rufina, Tuscany, Italy
Frescobaldi is one of the world's great wine dynasties as well as one of the most prestigious. The Castello di Nipozzano estate is situated 30 kilometres North East of Florence. The wine is 90% Sangiovesi with the remainder a blend of Malvasia Nera, Colorino, Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon. It has a full aroma with hints of cherry, strawberry, plum and dried flowers. The palate is powerful with sweet, evolved tannins, harmonious and elegant.

<p>Southern Right Pinotage 2007/08, Hemel-en-Aarde Valley, Harmanus, South Africa</p> <p><i>Small specialist producer founded by the respected Anthony Hamilton Russell in 1994. The early ripening pinotage grapes develop best in this cooler climate and produce a fantastic classic pinotage. Southern Right makes a contribution to Southern Right Whale Conservation with every bottle sold. This is an excellent example of Pinotage with good structure and developed tannins where the soft wood flavours are complemented by berry fruits on the palate.</i></p>	<p>£32.95</p>
<p>Crozes Hermitage 2006, Domaine Michelas St Jemms, Rhône, France ##</p> <p><i>This estate was created in 1861 and is now run by three sisters, using traditional labour-intensive viniculture methods. The wine has classic Syrah character of smoky bacon and plummy fruit with hints of black olives.</i></p>	<p>£33.95</p>
<p>Givry le Préféré du Roi Henri IV, 2000, Rémoissenet & Fils, Burgundy, France #</p> <p><i>Remoissenet has been involved in the world of wine for over two centuries and owns one of the largest cellars of aged Burgundy in the world. This Givry Premier Cru shows maturity with freshness. A well structured wine showing violets and spice and a hint of minerality.</i></p>	<p>£36.95</p>
<p>Aloxe Corton 2006/7, Domaine Nicolas Rossignol, Burgundy, France ##</p> <p><i>Nicolas Rossignol is one of the young generation of Burgundians who are making their mark on winemaking.
